People in Waiting

December is here, and with it comes the season of Advent—a time of waiting, preparation, and hope. As we light the candles, sing the carols, and read the prophecies of old, we find ourselves swept into the grand narrative of God's redemptive plan. Advent invites us to pause, to reflect, and to remember that we are a people in waiting.

For centuries, God's people waited for the Messiah, holding tightly to promises like Isaiah 9:6-7: "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end."

And then, in the fullness of time, the Christ came. Born in Bethlehem, the Light of the World broke into the darkness, fulfilling every promise and bringing hope, joy, and peace to a weary world.

Yet, Advent is not just about looking back to Christ's first coming; it is about looking forward to His return. Advent, derived from the Latin word, adventus simply means "coming" or "arrival." Just as Israel waited for the Messiah, we now wait for the King of kings to come again and make all things right and new.

And so, we await the return of Christ, who will appear a second time, not to deal with sin but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him (Hebrews 9:28).

But our waiting ought not to be passive one. It is an active, expectant anticipation. Let us await our Savior faithfully, prayerfully, and joyfully.

Faithfully obeying the Lord in all that he has commanded to us.

Prayerfully seeking the Lord's help to do all that we do in the strength that he alone can supply.

Joyfully proclaiming to a lost and dying world that the Messiah has come and they need wallow in their sins no longer. Salvation is offered to the least of us and the hope of heaven is promised to any and all weary sinner that desire to take hold of it by faith.



Making Lasting Christmas Memories

I've always loved the Christmas season—the time spent with family, the chance to slow down, create new memories, and reflect on the years past. One of my favorite childhood Christmas memories is an annual tradition our church hosted called *Bethlehem Experience*. It was an outdoor, walk-through, narrated Christmas production where you'd journey through seven scenes that told the story of Jesus' birth.

I've been told that I played the role of baby Jesus when I was just a few weeks old, and over the years, I took on various roles in all seven scenes. Even now, my brothers and sister still quote lines from the narration. It was a special memory for our entire family, and one that we all got to experience together. And yes, there were live animals in some of the scenes—sheep, donkeys, and even camels! Our church was located in the heart of the city, so seeing these farm animals in the middle of South St. Pete was quite the sight. I'll never forget one year when my dad was tasked with watching the animals overnight, and somehow, the sheep got loose. There was even a newspaper article about "sheep on Central Avenue in South St. Pete." It still makes us laugh.

I share these memories with you to ask: What Christmas memories is your family making this year? Will your children remember a time when Mom and Dad were too busy running errands, or will they recall the many ways they heard the Christmas story? Will they remember giving to others or the gifts they received? Here are some practical ways to make an eternal impact on your family this Christmas season:

- Attend our Jingle Jam Event on December 1 at 5:00 PM. It's a fun way to kick off the Christmas season! We'll play games, sing some worship songs, and hear the story of Jesus' birth. You'll also receive a resource to help you start the Advent season together.
- Read through the book of Luke each day from December 1–24. It's a wonderful way to walk through the entire story of Jesus' birth and life.
- Participate in an Advent activity as a family. Whether it's a devotional, a countdown calendar, or an act of service, these activities can help bring your family closer together.
- "Adopt" a child through the Salvation Army Christmas Tree. You can often find a tree at local stores like Walmart in Mt. Airy, with a list of items to purchase for a child in need.
- Create a reverse Advent calendar for a local food pantry. Each day leading up to Christmas, add an item to donate, and deliver the items to the food pantry on Christmas Eve (or the next time they're open).

My prayer for your family this Christmas season is that you grow closer to each other as you celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. I pray that the memories you make will be centered on Him, and that they will last for many years to come. In Christ,

Children flocked around her to try the sweet treats. Soon, mothers within the community invited Lottie into their homes where she told them about Jesus.

As made by Lottie moon Plain Tea Cake 3 teacups of sugar 1 teacup of butter 1 teacup of sour milk 4 pints of flour 3 eggs, well beaten 1/2 teaspoon of soda Flavor to taste. Roll thin. Bake in a quick oven. Adapted recipe for today's cooks Plain Tea Cake 2 cups of flour 1/2 cup butter 1 heaping cup of sugar 1 well-beaten egg 1 tablespoon cream Cream the butter and sugar. Add the egg and mix well. Add the flour and cream. Dust a board with flour. Roll the dough very thin. Cut cookies with a round cookie cutter. Place on a buttered or nonstick cookie sheet. Bake at 475 degrees for about 5 minutes.
